## From the Rector

Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

As is our tradition, the Good Shepherd offers opportunities for adult fellowship, study and prayer during the season of Advent.

At our Lake Wylie location, we will meet on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 beginning **December 3** to view the series "Christianity Explored." Christianity Explored is a course designed to "let the Gospel tell the gospel." We will open and explore Mark's gospel and look at who Jesus is, what His aims are and what it means to follow Him. This is a DVD oriented course led by Rico Tice, a priest in the Church of England. It is comparable (and perhaps best described as an extension) to the Alpha course. A study guide will be provided. If you plan on attending, please bring your Bible with you.

Some of you may remember our series last year in York on "The Anglican Experiment." This year on Tuesday evening in York, we will gather in order to see if we can determine "What it means to be an Episcopalian." and "What is the Episcopal Church"?

This will be an interactive discussion and I invite everyone to participate. The answers we discern may very well be the basis of our life together in the coming years. We will be using as our sources the Holy Bible, the Book of Common Prayer, the Book of Occasional Services, Enriching our Worship, The Hymnal, 1982 and the Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church, among others. If you plan on attending, please bring your Bible and your prayer book. We will gather at 7:00 p.m. beginning **December 2** in the parish hall in York.

Even though these offerings are aimed primarily at adults, I would welcome anyone who is interested (as long as they can sit still ☺).

May God's blessings be upon you as we enter into the Holy season of Advent.

P.S. As is our custom, we will be using Rite I liturgies during the four Sundays of Advent. Please note the difference in responses:

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

**People: And with thy spirit**

## Finance Update

As of the ten month period ending 10/31/08, we are running a deficit of \$14,132.51 in the Operating Fund. This compares to a planned deficit of \$14,715.82. Income is on budget with 83% of the year behind us. Total expenses are at 82.8%. Our operating reserve fund is

depleted. Our accumulated endowment fund earnings are also depleted due to the stock market conditions. This increases the importance of a successful 2009 stewardship campaign. The Dalton bequest is providing liquidity for us at this point. The Vestry believes the 2009 draft budget reflects what is needed to fund the operations of the parish. This will require pledge income of \$210,000 for 2009.

## Stewardship 2009

As of this writing on November 18, thirty pledge cards have been received. Updates to results of the campaign will be given in the Sunday service bulletins and additional mailings. If you have not yet made your pledge of time, talent and treasure for 2009, please do so as soon as possible. For all those who have responded, a grateful THANK YOU!

I would like to report receipt of a bequest from the Wallace B. Dalton Trust of \$224,000. A portion of the bequest, \$150,000, was paid to the church in October with the remaining amount to be paid over a three year period, in January of 2009, 2010 and 2011. We are most appreciative to Wally & Shirley Dalton for their gift, foresight and planning that made this donation possible.

It is the desire of the Finance Committee and Vestry that the principal portion of this gift be preserved as much as possible, with earnings on the funds used for major improvement and repair projects.

An amount of \$37,876.09 out of the bequest was "loaned" to the Walking the Way building fund to pay in full our loan with the Bank of York. This will save additional interest charges. This loan to the building fund will be repaid to the bequest funds as building fund pledge payments are received. Remaining pledge amounts to be collected will not fully fund this balance thus we are asking for new pledging as well as for all current pledges to be paid in full.
